Introduction

The winner of this league will get the club of the semester award, cash prizes, and different incentives. A proper points table will be maintained each semester. Moreover, other incentives include certificates and others for the club members.

Rewards

- A trophy to the club with the highest points for each semester.
- Certificates will be awarded to all the active club members whose clubs rank in the top 3 positions. Data will be collected in the report.
- The top 2 clubs will receive additional budget allocations as follows, to support future events and initiatives:
 - 1st Position: ₹4,200
 - 2nd Position: ₹2,800

Guidelines

Planning & Documentation

- Clubs must **submit their semester plans**, clearly outlining proposed activities.
- For **prebooking logistics and timely budget allocation**, clubs must **email a summary and budget** to

SCDC, keeping **Priyanshu Pradhan (22), Souptik Kar (23) and Natasha Sharma (24)** in CC.

- **Signed hard copies of notesheets** (by the club coordinator and faculty advisor) must be submitted to SCDC. Spending on events is **not permitted until approval** is received.
- All events must be **science-oriented, educational, and engaging**.
- Events must **not involve political agendas**, promote **discrimination**, or lead to any form of **harassment** or exclusion.

Club Management and Communication

- Clubs with **core/pre-core systems** must **update their core teams by December** each year.
- All clubs are expected to **check their official email accounts daily** to ensure smooth and timely communication.
- A **WhatsApp group for tech leads** will be created to ensure proper coordination, and an invitation email will be shared. All club tech leads **must join through that link. Websites must remain updated** to reflect current events, contacts, and documentation.

Leadership and Recognition

- The **Active Live Leaderboard** will be displayed during the competition phase.
- SSC will **track and review points and resolve discrepancies impartially**.
- **Negative points** will be imposed for **unhealthy competition or code of conduct violations**, as decided by SCDC, SSC Core, CSA Science Activity, and DoSA.

Event Content & Planning Guidelines

- Flagship events are excluded from the Events/Workshops category and must be announced at least two days in advance, with a minimum duration of two days and five hours of activity.
- Clubs must submit all flagship event proposals, approved by their faculty advisor, well before execution and inform SCDC via email, keeping Priyanshu Pradhan, Souptik Kar, and Natasha Sharma in CC.
- For participation in external competitions, clubs must share an email detailing student interest, including any quiz/interview processes and data collected via Google Forms.
- Clubs will not receive points if they form internal teams and participate without circulating the opportunity among the broader student community.
- It is not mandatory to include students from outside the club if there are no eligible candidates.
- Ecological trips, telescopic sessions, and other club-exclusive events are included in the Events/Workshops category.
- Publication points will only be awarded if the publication is officially released within the specified month.
- Online events and talks will be awarded points only if conducted during May–July or December.
- Online events and talks in collaboration with external clubs or organisations will be awarded only if conducted between January and April, and August and September.
- Collaboration points will be awarded once per semester for each collaboration. A valid proof of collaboration must include a standard MoU outlining joint activities such as events, workshops, talks, or resource sharing, duly signed by both parties.
- Even if a single post contains multiple photos (e.g., 5 photos) and receives a minimum of 30 likes, the club will be awarded a maximum of 5 points only.
- Clubs will be awarded points for completing 80% of their planned events only after submitting a semester-end report. This report must outline the events, talks, and collaborations conducted, and should match at least 80% of the proposed activities shared earlier. Clubs must submit this report at the end of the semester.
- Each club must submit a comprehensive club report that includes the names, institute email IDs of coordinators, core members, and the faculty advisor. It should also mention details of collaborations and publications from both the previous and current year, events previously conducted, the budget utilised, and a clear list of planned events for the current year. Any delay in submitting the club report will result in a deduction of 10 points for each week of delay.
